

Daniel Wulff obtained his Bachelor of Arts Degree in Sociology, with an emphasis on Law and Criminal Deviance, in December 1986, from the University of Minnesota. He was commissioned as an Army Lieutenant in 1986, and entered active duty on January 1, 1987, as an Air Defense Artillery Officer. He served as a platoon leader and liaison to NATO forces. He was responsible for the supervision of 45 soldiers and the maintenance of \$3 million in equipment, coordinated training and air defense mission requirements, and conducted briefings on Air Defense issues for a Mechanized Infantry Brigade and German army units.

After 3 ½ years of active duty service in Germany, he transitioned to the US Army Reserves, where he served in a Psychological Operations unit, where he was promoted to Captain. He transferred to the Inactive Reserve in 1996, and received an Honorable Discharge in 2000.

Military training included the Air Defense Officer Basic Course, in Ft. Bliss, TX, in 1987, and US Army Psychological Operations Officer Qualification in 1992 at the US Army JFK Special Warfare Center and School.
